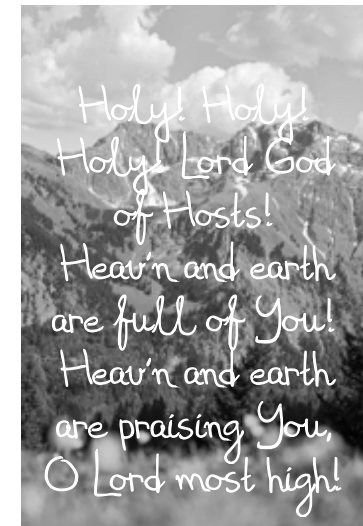

Romans 5:12-17... Two Adams...

*O, loving wisdom of our God!
When all was sin and shame,
a second Adam to the fight
and to the rescue came.*

- What happened when Adam sinned?
 - Did Adam's sin affect us in any way?
 - Is our problem that we commit individual sins, or does our problem run deeper?
 - Do we have a sinful nature?
- Note, at the end of verse 12, Paul explains more of Adam and Christ, before returning to his point in verse 18.

In Adam, is sin and death (v.12)

- God gave life and promised continuing life conditional on Adam's obedience. But his disobedience brought sin to all humanity – and sin, brought death.

Adam is our representative (v.13-14)

- People still died before the law was given to Moses, because Adam is our representative.
- Adam was a pattern of Christ, the true Humanity. Note, Adam must have lived.
- Jesus' temptations were an echo of Adam's. Where old Adam failed, the Second Adam succeeded.

In Christ, is grace and gift (v.15-17)

- Note, Adam's single sin condemned all, whilst Jesus' life of obedience brought justification and life.
- In Adam, sin and death reign. In Christ, life and righteousness reign.
- In Christ is greater blessing than Adam lost!

Plenteous grace with You is found,
grace to cover all my sin:
let the healing streams abound;
make and keep me pure within.
